Hello all! I hope everyone survived the cold weather and winter months. We have turned a corner into warmer weather and have completed some important projects in the last year. There are numerous other, equally as important projects started for the upcoming season. We have many dedicated trustees that have been hard at work planning events, setting agendas, and talking with contractors for improvement projects. We continue to tackle the routinely difficult task of staffing lifeguards for our beach, in addition to implementing many other improvements. These wonderful amenities are right in our back yard. Our neighborhood has built something very special in order for all of us to have access to quality recreational space that rivals many city parks, all while operating on a fraction of their budgets. We concluded last year with multiple lighting projects, a new pickle ball court, LED lighting around the park, additional asphalt grindings for the park entrance, and the much needed safety focused dredging project around the dock area. We're committed to ongoing improvements in our park! We're excited to announce the installation of a brand-new playground set, and we're also tackling several other key projects. These include repairing the uneven concrete slab in the clubhouse (a long-standing safety concern), sandblasting and repainting the existing swing sets to match the new playground, upgrading park lighting, repairing and patching the pavilion, replacing the library booth, and addressing damaged park equipment. Maintaining our park and staying informed about city projects requires significant effort. To continue enhancing our neighborhood and home values, we invite you to consider joining our HOA board. The grant will pay for us to control invasive plant species, thin the small caliper trees to left of park entry drive, and place bird, bat, and duck boxes around conservation lands. WYOGA LAKE PARK RULES

To be accepted into membership, your household MUST agree to abide by the following:

- Wyoga Lake Park is owned, operated, and maintained by the Wyoga Lake Homeowner's Association (WLHA) for the exclusive use of its paying members.
- Paid members are permitted to bring non-resident guests and shall accompany them while in the park.
- The park is open from dawn to dusk. This excludes WLHA sponsored events.
- NO glass bottles or glass containers are permitted within the park.
- All pets must be leashed at all times. Owners are responsible for picking up after their pets.
- NO smoking on the beach, on the playground, in the pavilion, within any park building, or within 10 feet of these locations.
- Camping is prohibited in the park without permission from the Board of Trustees.
- Fires are not permitted outside of the lakeside fire ring. A recreational fire may be permitted, provided that it has been approved from a Board member.
- Fires are not permitted after 11pm. All fires must use only clean dry wood.
- No fireworks permitted in the park.

WYOGA LAKE SWIMMING RULES

- The beach is a swim at your own risk beach.
- No swimming after dusk.
- During the summer months, the WLHA may provide lifeguards as an additional safety measure.
- WLHA assumes no responsibility for swimmers.
- · Swimmers shall obey all lifeguard commands. Those not cooperating with lifeguard instructions shall be asked to leave the park.
- NO diving off the swim platform except from the diving board.
- NO swimming under the swim platform.
- NO "horseplay" on the beach or in the water.
- NO obscene language or gestures.
- NO swimming during safety breaks.
- · Lifeguards have the right to test your swimming level.

WYOGA LAKE BOATING & FISHING RULES

- · Fishing from shore only permitted in the boating area.
- WLHA members may store a boat along the Eastern fence line. Stored boats must be registered with WLHA.
- Boats should be secured, and oriented in a way as to not accumulate standing
- No combustion engines; just electric trolling motors permitted.
- · WLHA assumes no responsibility for damage to stored boats.
- Users of WLHA owned watercraft must wear personal flotation devices (life jackets) at all times.
